Past Tense

## PAST TENSE VERBS

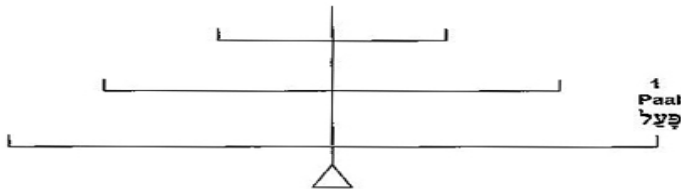
### PAAL (verb pattern 1)

To form Paal, place the vowel sign  under the first letter of the root, and the vowel sign  under the second letter of the root.

פָּעַל

This is the form of the 3rd person masculine singular, past tense.

The position of Paal on the menorah diagram:



Below is a newspaper extract containing a Paal verb

הָיָה זֶה עֶרֶב קָרְנָה הַיָּמִי בְּעִיר נְיוֹ יוֹרְק. הַמְּאָכַסֶּת סָגְרָה אֶת הַמְּשַׁכְּרֵי וְנִצְאָה לְרִחּוֹב הַמּוֹשְׁלֵג. בְּחוּץ כֶּן הַתַּחֲמִיל לְנִדָּה שֶׁלֵּג שֶׁהַכְּפִיד עַל הַלְּיָחֹר. נָאֵז הָרָא שֶׁמֶע מַנְגִּינָה שֶׁהוֹפְיָה לּוֹ קָאוֹר אֶת גְּלוּחָו.

The verb **קָנָר** in the newspaper extract above belongs to Paal. It is in the form of the 3rd person masculine singular, past tense.

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
