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1. Project aim

- To profile the Library, Archives, Records Information and Knowledge Management professions in the UK
- Commissioned by ARA and CILIP

2. Method

- Analysis of secondary data from the UK Labour Force Survey
- Analysis of 9,103 survey returns completed by UK information workers

3. Main findings

- Estimated workforce size of 86,376
- Majority based in England
- Ageing workforce
- Lack of diversity
- High level of qualifications – yet some evidence of low pay
- High numbers of women - yet men occupy senior and well-paid roles

4. Value and impact

- First national workforce mapping study of its kind
- Informs strategy of CILIP and ARA
- Provides evidence for advocacy
- Contributed to UK government consultation on the future of libraries
- Led to call for a National Library and Information Skills Strategy
